19/156 ITEM 3a - KTC Public Speaking Session

The Treasurer of Town Twinning attended the meeting to speak about the group's grant request for funding. He explained that 2019 sees the 50 year anniversary of the signing in Bebra and 2020 will be the anniversary of signing in Knaresborough. He spoke about fund raising efforts throughout the year, including a German night and a 2020/21 calendar. A race night is planned for later in the year.

NYCC Highways will be looking at various projects and investment made across the district, a significant element of which has come into Knaresborough. He mentioned an additional £13M awarded to NYCC last November to be spent prior to the end of the municipal year following a focused review.

Members agreed that a formal letter of thanks should be sent to NYCC following the successful re-organisation of traffic flow at Bond End with the installation of mini roundabouts.

Councillor A Wright:

"Knaresborough Town Council notes with regret that Barclays bank have announced the closure of its Knaresborough office. KTC recognises the importance of retaining the last bank branch in Knaresborough which is Halifax bank. As an attempt to try and encourage Halifax to remain, KTC will seek to open a Town Council account with Halifax and, assuming this is successful, will transfer all its business into the Halifax Knaresborough Branch."

In view of further information provided, Councillor Wright decided not to move this motion. It was noted that Halifax Bank does not provide business banking facilities and transference of town council business is not possible.

Discussion followed and Councillors agreed that as much as possible should be done to publicise the importance of retaining a bank presence in Knaresborough. Following a meeting with the branch Manager of a local bank, Councillor Goode had been provided with details of the measures that bank uses to determine the success of its branches; he promised to share this information with colleagues. Members were meanwhile asked to email the office with any ideas which they feel could contribute towards town council helping to promote the retention of a bank presence in Knaresborough. Members recognised the importance of town council maintaining a neutral stance in regard to individual regulated banking providers.
