25/249 ITEM 3 - KTC Public Speaking Session

Two members of Knaresborough Chamber attended the meeting to outline the North Yorkshire Council (NYC) Community Wealth Building Project which aims to engage medium to large sized businesses in the wider Knaresborough area who may have the potential to contribute to the socio economic and environmental assets of the District. Further information to be distributed and the item will be included on a future full council agenda.

3a North Yorkshire Councillors to give verbal updating report on unitary authority matters.

Councillor Gostlow:

> Councillor Gostlow informed members that NYC member budget seminars are being held ahead of NYC's full council budget meeting in February 2026.

- > There have been issues with the new NYC planning portal as the public access area transitions to a new system.
- ➤ There are also issues surrounding Planning Enforcements which are being addressed at NYC Area Committee level.
- ➤ NYC is looking to formulate a policy on the future of public toilets and Councillor Gostlow would be interested to hear other KTC members' views about toilets in the town. (Councillor Batt pointed out that the toilets in the castle grounds are part of the Duchy of Lancaster estate and do not belong to NYC).

Councillor Walker:

- Councillor Walker referred to a meeting with NYC Highways to discuss drains in the town, where 30 drains have been found to require some remedial work. He asked members to inform either himself or Councillor Gostlow if they are aware of any specific problems.
 - Highways also confirmed they will be undertaking some work to update the NYC online portal.
 - A schedule for leaf clearing has been received and a gritting schedule circulated.
- > Some residents are still experiencing problems with waste collection, particularly assisted collections. The NYC system has now been updated but if members are aware of any further problems they should contact Councillors Walker or Gostlow.

25/252 ITEM 6 - Reports/Information from the Clerk

6.1 To consider the advised amendments to the NYC commuted sums mapping for King George V field as discussed with the KTC commuted sums working group.

Councillor Gostlow explained the rationale for the suggested mapping amendments and members discussed these along with the broader perspective on the field's use.

RESOLVED: That KTC supports the proposed merger of the 4 OSF ID's into a single entity for investment across the whole of the King George V field, and as a follow up to the

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development of the project, KTC revisits the existing contract currently in use for the hire of the field.

6.2 To consider a request from the Clerk to receive payment for a proportion of the time in lieu built up over recent months as there has been no opportunity to take time off.

The Clerk explained the reasons for the request, and it was:

RESOLVED: That KTC supports the Clerk's request for a proportion of payment in lieu as discussed and very much appreciate all her hard work.

6.3 To consider staffing requirements specifically related to the Wednesday Market and **decide** next steps to be taken (awaiting information from NYC at time of print).

RESOLVED: That in view of the confidential nature of the business to be transacted re **ITEM 6.3** pertaining to staffing, the item be dealt with in private session and, subject to the provisions of Section 1(2) of the Public Bodies (Admission to Meetings) Act 1960 (as amended), the meeting be not open to members of the public.

RESOLVED: That for the purposes of budget planning for the financial year 2026/2027, KTC considers appointing two new roles, a Town Manager and an Administrative resource to support the day to day management of the market on Wednesdays.

Staffing Committee to take this forward.

RESOLVED: To come out of confidential session

6.4 To consider the 6-month financial position and agree the budget to inform the precept request for 2026/27.

The Clerk explained the rationale behind the figures in the budget spread sheet which had been circulated and informed members that she had kept any data relating to the potential operation of the market as a separate entity. She also explained that this budget reflected preparation for costs which the Town Council has not encountered previously.

RESOLVED: That based on the budget set for 2026/2027 (copy spread sheet attached) KTC submits a precept request to North Yorkshire Council for £280,351.

We were also supported on the day by the current Mayor of Knaresborough.
